PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I would like to thank all of the parents, carers staff and students for helping to make the post-Covid return to school a positive experience. Across the world, families are having to adapt to a 'new normal', and schools have had to revise policies, practices and procedures to make sure we are all Covid secure. The teachers and support staff have worked incredibly hard to keep everyone safe while continuing to deliver quality education, but this couldn't be done without your support.



We are very excited to report that the new building is on track to be ready for the end of December, meaning that in January we can be in our new surroundings. This will be a big change for everybody, and we will be contacting you again next half term with updates about home to school travel and familiarisation visits. It is likely that the school will be closed on Friday 18th December 2020 and Monday 4th January 2021 to allow us to pack everything up and unpack in the new classrooms. We will confirm this as soon as we have confirmed dates of the completion.

As the nights get darker, and we approach Halloween and Bonfire Night, I would urge all of you to speak to your children about keeping safe when out and about with friends. We work closely with Cleveland Police and Cleveland Fire Brigade to share important messages with our young people, but these need to be continuously reinforced by you. Let's work together to make sure all pupils/students stay safe.

We will be reviewing and updating our Covid risk assessment at half term. We are pleased that to date we have not had any confirmed cases of Covid 19 in school, and as such we have not had to isolate any 'bubbles'. Teachers have ensured that remote learning activities are ready and available if the need does arise for any groups of pupils to isolate. If your child is isolating because they have come into contact with a confirmed case outside of school, or because they or a family member are isolating and awaiting test results, it's important you let school know.

We have had an amazing half term with lots of excellent learning activities throughout the school. Please read our newsletter and enjoy talking to your child about the activities!

Fantastic Food!


