


Anti-Bullying - We have been marking anti-bulling week in LKS3 and we have worked on knowing what bullying is and what we should do if we see or know someone who is bullying or being bullied. This led us to think about our words that we choose to use. To show this we use a tube of toothpaste to show how when we use words its very difficult to take them back, the toothpaste being squeezed out is like when we use unkind words and the pupils tried to put the 'words' or toothpaste back in to the tube. The pupils will tell you that this is almost an impossible task!
