Out Year 11's are joining us on Wednesday for a "Night at the Oscars" themed event. All the staff and students in secondary would like to wish them all good luck for the future!!








Maths

Our Secondary pupils (and staff) all had a brilliant time on their end of year rewards trip to Flamingo Land.














The Marvellous Maya!

Amethyst have continued Hola Mexico! Topic by learning about the Ancient Mayas


this half term. They have learnt all about the Maya civilisation and their deities and have built their own Maya temples from Lego.
